#### SESSION ACTIVITY PICKS UP – PLEASE CHECK THE WEEKLY SCHEDULE & YOUR UPDATED BILL TRACKER

#### WINTER STORM LANDON INTERRUPTS LEGISLATURE

A winter storm which spread from the Rocky Mountains to the Great Plains, Midwest and Northeast interrupted the Kansas Legislative Schedule this week. Winter Storm <u>Landon</u> brought ice, snow and freezing temperatures to the state and caused House and Senate leadership to call-off most committee meetings on Wednesday and Thursday. As a result, many have been rescheduled for next week.

#### **GOVERNOR VETOES REDISTRICING MAP**

Governor Laura Kelly <u>announced</u> late Thursday that she has vetoed a plan to redraw Congressional districts that was sent to her desk. The map – <u>dubbed Ad Astra 2</u> – was passed by the <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> along party lines. In statements issued Thursday, both <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> leadership noted they would work to override the Governor's actions.

### **IT PROJECTS OVERSIGHT BILL HEARD IN COMMITTEE**

After almost a year of discussion, the <u>House Appropriations Committee</u> heard a bill that proponents hope will help provide more oversight over the state's IT projects. <u>HB2548</u> would change reporting requirements to be based on a risk-based model rather than a monetary threshold. As outlined in the bill, security, cost, and other key risk indicators will used to determine whether a project is reportable, which proponents hope will provide a more wholistic review of particular projects.

The bill also allows the <u>Joint Committee on Information Technology</u> (JCIT) to advise and consult on projects that pose a significant business risk as determined by <u>Information Technology Executive Council</u> (ITEC) policies. As part of that process, project presentations can be provided to the full committee if requested by two or more members of JCIT. The bill also provides updates and clarifies provisions to the <u>Kansas</u> <u>Cybersecurity Act</u>.

The bill is being supported by Rep. <u>Kyle Hoffman</u> (R-Coldwater) who is currently the Chair of JCIT (another principal sponsor of the bill) and Vice Chair of the powerful House Appropriations Committee. No word yet on when the bill will be worked.

### **BUDGET HEARINGS BEGIN**

Budget subcommittees in both the House and Senate began to hear various budgets this week before reporting out before their respective full appropriations committees. State agencies, stakeholders and others presented to several budget panels this week.

As a reminder, the Legislature has the ability to accept, modify, reject or totally rebuild the state's budget, regardless of the Governor's recommendations. Similar to previous years, Republican leadership in both the House and Senate are expected to make changes to the Democratic Governor's plan.

### **RESTRICTIONS ON WIND TURBINES TO BE CONSIDERED**

Lawmakers will address an issue next week that could impact wind turbines that are being deployed across the state. <u>SB353</u> would require wind turbine developers to submit construction applications to the local board of county commissioners and would outline certain setback and other construction requirements. The bill would also call for county commissioners to publish notice and hold hearings if a turbine wants to be constructed. Turbine acoustic noise measurement tests would be required to be performed by the developer and requirements for insurance that needs to be held by the developer are also outlined in the bill.

The bill is one of several measures that imposes more restrictions on wind and solar energy developments that has been introduced this year. It is expected to have two days of hearings next week in the <u>Utilities</u> <u>Committee</u>. The measure was requested for introduction by the committee's Chairman, Sen. <u>Mike</u> <u>Thompson</u> (R-Shawnee). Kansas is one of the <u>top states</u> that generates its electricity from wind.

## BILL REQUIRING OTHER TYPES OF COVID-19 TREATMENTS TO BE WORKED; POSSIBLE VOTE TO OCCUR

The Senate <u>Public Health & Welfare Committee</u> will work a <u>bill</u> that would allow for doctors to prescribe and dispense certain medications to prevent and treat COVID-19. SB381 would require pharmacists to dispense the medications, which would include, but are not limited to, hydroxychloroquine sulfate and ivermectin. The bill would also contain provisions that would prevent civil suits from being brought against pharmacists and healthcare providers dispensing the medication and would prohibit the Board of Pharmacy from sanctioning any provider from providing the drugs. The liability provisions would be retroactive to the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic: March 12, 2020. A committee hearing was held on the bill on January 25, 2022 and had to be extended into the next day due to the number of conferees. Opponents of the measure include the state's largest medical providers, such as the <u>University of Kansas Health System and Ascension Via Christi Health</u>. Proponents included physicians, including Sen. Dr. <u>Mark Steffen</u> (R-Hutchison) who is a primary <u>supporter</u> of the bill, and private citizens.

If the bill is worked and successfully passed out of committee, it will be sent to the full Senate Committee.

## ECONOMIC INCENTIVE BILL STALLS IN HOUSE COMMITTEE; DEBATE TO CONTINUE NEXT WEEK

A <u>measure</u> that would help Kansas stay in the running for a massive investment project by a yet-to-be announced company was stalled this week in House Committee. The bill passed the Senate late last week by a vote of <u>37-2</u>, although it was amended with some provisions that could negatively impact the state's ability to successfully win the mysterious project, including taking away the refundable element of the Investment Tax Credit.

House leadership, led by Speaker Pro Tem <u>Blaine Finch</u> (R-Ottawa) unveiled some new ideas on Thursday, including: new provisions on corporate income tax, refundability of the investment tax credit, payroll tax refund caps, reimbursement for training costs for suppliers, and provisions for local governments to allow how much property tax abatement the project would receive. That plan is expected to be fully vetted Monday.

The bill is being pushed hard by the Governor's office, and by some members of House and Senate leadership, who are trying to win a massive manufacturing project that is expected to bring in \$4 billion in investment to the state. It is also supposed to generate an annual investment of \$2.5 billion in economic activity and create 8,000 jobs, making it one of the biggest deals in Kansas history.

### SEVERAL HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AND INVESTMENT BILLS INTRODUCED

Following several years of record high housing prices, and record low housing inventory, a number of bills have been introduced this Session in the <u>Senate Federal & State Affairs Committee</u> that are designed to help solve these ongoing problems. These bills include the following:

- <u>SB369</u> This proposal would allow for a tax credit for qualifying low-income housing projects. The projects would be determined by the Kansas Housing Resource Corporation. The bill will have a hearing February 9.
- <u>SB375</u> This measure would provide for tax credits for investment in residential housing projects in underserved rural and urban communities to accommodate for new employees. Qualified housing projects that fit the criteria established by the bill would need to apply for such a designation, which would then be decided by the Secretary of Commerce. The bill will have a hearing February 7.
- <u>SB376</u> SB376 would generally expand current Kansas housing programs, such as the Kansas Rural Housing Incentive District, to allow use of bond proceeds for construction of residential homes to include the city of Topeka, increasing availability of loans or grants to rural communities for moderate income housing, establishing a program for urban communities for moderate income housing and permit housing developments to include manufactured or modular housing. The bill will also have a hearing February 7.
