KANSAS LANDS ANOTEHR MEGA PROJECT USING APEX INCENTIVES

Governor Laura Kelly <u>announced</u> on Thursday that Wichita-based <u>Integra Technologies</u> will expand its operations and become one of the largest computer chip companies in the country. The company, which already was a major manufacturer of semiconductors, will add to its operation nearly 2,000 jobs and a million-square-foot facility in Wichita.

Like the recently <u>announced</u> agreement to bring a Panasonic battery factory to the Kansas City area, the deal involves the use of incentives authorized by the <u>Attracting Powerful Economic Expansion</u> or APEX program that was created through <u>legislation</u> last Session. In a contract finalized in executive session on Thursday, lawmakers and the Governor agreed to provide \$304 million in tax incentives over the next 10 years in exchange for an estimated \$1.8 billion investment by Integra. The deal is also contingent upon the company receiving additional incentives from the federal CHIPS Act. Specifically, the incentives include the following:

- 10-year 10% capital investment tax credit
- 8.5% payroll reimbursement for 10 years
- \$25 million for employee training over five years
- \$1 million per year for employee relocation for 10 years
- Sales tax exemption for construction materials and equipment for five years

Additional economic development projects may be announced in the future, according to Deputy Secretary for Business Development <u>Paul Hughes</u>, including a possible project with <u>EMP Shield</u> in Burlington. No further details were immediately provided.

CREDIT CARD SURCHARGE BILLS BEING FLOATED

Two bills that would allow vendors the option to impose or eliminate fees on purchases with debit or credit cards are moving through the legislative process. On Monday, the <u>House Committee on Financial</u> <u>Institutions and Pensions</u> heard <u>HB 2133</u>. In testimony, proponents noted that Kansas is one of only four states to still have a prohibition on assessing fees in statute, and that all similar statutes have been vacated by the US Supreme Court in *Expressions Hair Design v. Schneiderman*. Further, proponents noted that if they were able to impose a surcharge, it would help absorb some costs for small business. A similar <u>bill</u> will be heard on Thursday in the <u>Senate Financial Institutions and Insurance Committee</u>. There has been no word yet on whether either bill will be worked.

ROAD REPAIR TAX FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLES DISCUSSED

The <u>House Transportation Committee</u> heard a <u>bill</u> that would impose a road repair tax on electricity used to power electric vehicles (EVs). The bill would require a tax equal to \$.03 per kilowatt-hour for energy used by consumers at public electric charging stations. Proponents argued this bill will keep Kansas ahead of the curve in terms of having a sustainable source of funds to maintain its highways as more consumers choose EVs over traditional combustion engines. Opponents noted that the bill would push a "double tax" on EV owners, who already pay a higher registration fee when the vehicle is purchased, and will discourage the installation of chargers and purchase of vehicles themselves. The bill has not yet been scheduled to be worked.

\$1 BILLION DOLLAR TRANSFER TO RAINY DAY FUND PROPOSED

The <u>Senate Ways & Means Committee</u> heard a <u>proposal</u> on Tuesday that would transfer \$1 billion to the state's rainy day fund, as a time when the state is bringing in record tax receipts and federal funds. The bill is a sharp jump from the \$500 million that was <u>proposed</u> by the Governor in her budget. Newly elected State Treasurer <u>Steven Johnson testified in support</u> of the bill and emphasized the timing was right – given competitive interest rates – to make the transfer. The bill is not yet scheduled to be worked.

LAWMAKERS CONSIDER MODIFYING RURAL HOUSING INCENTIVE STATUTES

Senator <u>Rob Olson</u> is continuing to champion housing incentives as the state grapples with a shortage of dwellings. SB 34 would expand the use and availability of rural housing incentive districts – which was the subject of <u>legislation</u> signed into law last year – to cities with a population of 60,000 people or more. It also would also allow for incentives to be used on residential, multi-family units on existing lots that have older infrastructure. <u>SB 37</u> would allow transferability of housing tax credits to another taxpayer. Both bills will be heard on Wednesday in the Senate Financial Institutions and Insurance Committee.

"ROFR" BILL EMERGES IN KANSAS

Like several other legislatures across the country, Kansas lawmakers will soon hear a bill regarding transmission lines and the right of first refusal (ROFR). <u>SB_68</u> would provide incumbent electric transmission owners a right of first refusal for the construction, upgrading, ownership, and maintenance of certain electric transmission lines. Incumbent owners would be required to provide written notice of their intent to construct, own, or upgrade such lines to the regional transmission organization. If there are two or more incumbent transmission owners, the right of first refusal would be determined by mutual agreement between them. Although a hearing has yet to be held, the debate typically pits incumbent

utility companies against ratepayer advocacy groups. The bill will be heard and possibly worked all next week in the <u>Senate Utilities Committee</u>.
